The construction of schools was one of the most important tasks of modernizing social infrastructure in interwar Lithuania, which was in line with the general European trends. This school had a first-class reputation from the very start because it was built in the vicinity of the envisaged Resurrection Church. For perhaps the very first time in Lithuania the school  $\square$  structure followed the progressive principle of functional zoning. The first and only swimming pool in Lithuania was installed there. J. Jablonskis gymnasium can also be considered
